DISCUSSION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Academics: finishing up benchmarks (3rd and 4th scores are over all strong-above district average); Kinder DIBELS-many are low, but hoping for strong growth through the year. - Stacey Cada will be meeting with grade level teams to form an ELA and Math goal, in accordance with data from the previous quarter (Q1)

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - October-Literacy theme. ELA is a struggle overall for the school (math is pretty good). Strong push to show growth, so the Fall Festival on October 26 (5-7:30) has a literacy theme. Classroom doors being decorated in a book theme. Classrooms will have crafts, story activities during the evening. Budget is \$250 from PTSA (mostly for craft and supplies). Trying to get food trucks, kids can wear their costumes. PTSA is thinking of asking families for bags of candy to put together bags for kids to get after they have finished their punch card. PTSA looking for more members. - Finances- Title 1 Reduction. This hits us in the areas of TAs, so it's a challenge in classrooms for teachers to do everything that they need to do without that extra support. - Hard push for getting tax credits to help support various things on the campus (T.A. positions, OMA, 5th grade G.C. trip). Banners will be coming from Tucson High print shop to promote-idea to request support from Caterpillar, Banner. - Need more parent involvement at the school and connect with the community for things like tax credits and support. - Climate and culture: focus on building a kind community. A few incidents of bullying at the beginning of the year. Ms. B and Ms. M have done many lessons in all classrooms on these topics. Mr. Brady had a serious talk with 5th grade about bullying and cyberbullying. Behaviors have been improving. Ms. B is doing a great job with the character traits. Kids seem to love coming to school. Trash pickup group has formed. - Ms. Munoz is MTSS-working on behavior and academic plans. - Staff is amazing. - Parent/Community involvement-need more of it and want to work on improving that. - Facilities and safety-bond project. We are not in process yet at Oyama, but flooring, lights and coverings at the basketball court, redo AC, security gates, windows, cameras... are slated for the school.
