

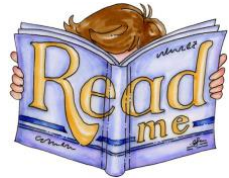

Oyama School students join staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in reading.

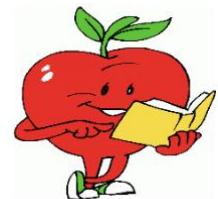
- Talk with my family about what I am learning in reading.

- Use class updates, this compact, web page, email, communicate with parents through Class Dojo, and have access to myself and other staff to ensure on-going communication regarding student progress.
- Teach students how to read aloud at home and keep a reading log.
- Listen to students read and read orally to my students while modeling correct reading behavior.
- Set and maintain high expectations for myself and my students.

- Have fun with reading. Use the materials from the library to explore reading at home.
- Look for the newsletter each month and read it.
